- The Elders contacted most of the people on the Member Review list. They reported on communication. John Jones submitted his resignation effective June 1, 2023. The proposal made by Rev. Barb Muhs last month does not meet the criteria for liability. She was not interested in applying for an interim position or part-time pastor and working through the Search and Call Committee. She will serve as pulpit supply through Sunday, June 4, 2023.
- Worship service options were discussed: Find another half-time pulpit supply, Members lead services that might include upbeat music, Traditional sermon, a TED talk, more action projects, more community, Taizé. Worship committee: Mike Morgan. Julie Kundel, and Mike Johannsen.
- Recognition: A letter of recognition to John Jones will be written. Moved by Jan Collinson to purchase a cake, hold a reception and promote attendance. Second by Deb Hagy. Motion carried.

Trustees'

- Dave has Installed a smart thermostat in the sanctuary.
- Repaired the lights in the entryway and the flood light by the entryway.
- Installed the back door (east) outside light by the garden space.
- Installed the lighting by the back door by parking (North).
- The bell tower is deteriorating. We need to find out if there is a steel interior. Dan Huss will look for the original plans for the church.

- Network upgrade on computers to RNS standards. no action
- Is there a need for compensation from the church for officiants beyond the family's gifts with memorial services at the church? Conference guidelines will be researched.


2. Updates:

Solar Energy

"The amount of sunlight that strikes the earth's surface in an hour and a half is enough to handle the entire world's energy consumption for a full year. Solar energy can be used to generate electricity or be stored in batteries or thermal storage.

Solar radiation is light. Solar technologies capture this radiation and turn it into useful forms of energy. PV materials and devices convert **sunlight** into electrical energy. A single PV device is known as a cell. These cells are made of different **semiconductor materials** and sandwiched between protective materials in a combination of glass and/or plastics.

To boost the **power output** of PV cells, they are connected together in chains to form larger units known as modules or panels. Modules can be used individually, or several can be connected to form arrays. One or more arrays are then connected to the **electrical grid** as part of a complete PV system. Because of this modular structure, PV systems can be built to meet almost any electric power need, small or large."
