Just days later SIHP was able to deliver beds to multiple children in our community.

Open and Affirming News

Next Meeting will be Hybrid style on March 7th at 6 pm.



The Rev. Dr. Karen
Georgia A. Thompson
is the General Minister and President
of the United Church of Christ. Rev.
Thompson is the first woman and first
woman of African descent to serve as
leader of the denomination.

Prior to this call, Rev. Thompson served in the national setting of the United Church of Christ for 14 years – two years as Minister for Racial Justice, eight years as Minister for Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations and four years as the Associate General Minister for Wider Church Ministries and Co-Executive for Global Ministries. She was elected as AGM in 2019. Her passion for justice and equity moved her work on behalf of the UCC into a global context, affording the opportunity to participate globally in efforts to reduce the marginalization experienced by African descendant peoples and other communities globally.

Before joining the national staff, Rev. Thompson served in the Florida Conference United Church of Christ as a Pastor and on the Conference staff as the Minister for Disaster Response and Recovery. She also worked in the nonprofit arena for over 10 years in senior leaderships positions.

Rev. Thompson earned a Bachelor of Arts from Brooklyn College in New York, a Master's in Public Administration from North Carolina Central University in Durham, NC, and a Masters of Divinity from Union Theo-

logical Seminary in New York. She also studied Public Policy at Duke University and earned her Doctorate in Ministry at Seattle University. She was awarded an honorary doctorate from Heidelberg University.

VESTRY SUMMARY FEBRUARY 12, 2024

<u>Treasurer</u> – Rich Carroll Budget report; a motion was made to move leftover money, (\$6,719.04) to the contingency fund. Motion carried.

There was a motion to purchase a service from Reliable Network Solutions for about \$450 per year to handle/help us with QuickBooks. Motion carried.

<u>Elders – Staff Updates: Pat Mundell submitted a letter of resignation from the Congregational Life Coordinator.</u> She will continue to mentor others through the end of the year, but after 2024 will only continue with the Bags of Blessings.

<u>Trustees – Property Report</u>

Carpet/pew cleaning: We received a \$3,929.60 bid from Phelps for cleaning the carpets and pews. There was a motion to spend Wendell Day funds to pay for carpet and pew cleaning, second. Motion carried. We will continue to explore the funds needed to replace the current carpet with hard/long lasting flooring.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>

- Discussed Lent-Easter worship schedule.
- Discussed funeral costs for non-members. It was moved to table this topic until they get more information. Motion carried.
- A Pastor-Parish Relations Committee has been established and Associate Conference Minister Kendy Miller will hold a training. Members of the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee are Deb Hagy, Janet Sichterman, Tim Stelzner, and Mike Johannsen.
- Pastor Paris' course on UCC History and Polity is on Saturday, Feb. 17
- We will have an installation service for Pastor Paris on the afternoon of April 28th, 2024
- Strategic planning 2024 Pastor and Allison will lead us in establishing a mission, vision, and goals. We will dive deeper into who we are and what we do by asking why. This helps with clarifying steps toward executing any goals we may set.

Old Business

- The Church began an online Church Directory trial on January 24th the account will automatically renew at the yearly rate of \$154.88 on 2/23/2024. This is an online directory that allows members to input their information and update it as needed. There was a motion to stay with the church directory account for one year while we continue to look at other options. Second, Motion carried.
- Auditor still needed for the 2023 books: asking Leslie Soule.
- The Congregational Life Grants committee is Jan Collinson, Scott Warren, Bill Creasey. We have multiple grants submitted already.

New Business

- Vestry representatives were chosen for 2024.
- There was a motion made to provide a safe space for Muscatine High School's GSA, plus West Liberty and Wilton students when needed. ONA will find volunteers to welcome them and lock the church when they are finished. Second, Motion carried.


- Sign task force: Funding to begin!




