God speaks in our hearts "with sighs too deep for human words" (Romans 8). And God speaks through spirited debate as we seek to discern the right thing to do. In all these ways, God stretches our imagination for what's possible and what's necessary. Together: God calls us into community. We follow Jesus as siblings in faith. United with other believers, we form a Christian movement living the way of Jesus. Faith is not a solitary life but one that brings our hearts close to others. As a statement of faith from the United Church of Canada affirms, "We are not alone; we live in God's world." The spiritual practice of generosity arises from imagining all that God calls us to do as a community. Our donations to our congregation make it possible to turn what we imagine into a reality. Through our annual commitments to our congregation, we imagine together all that we can do.

<u>A Message from the Deacons</u>

Setting a budget can be challenging and asking for money is never fun, especially at a time when money seems scarce. However, giving can be act of faith. We know that our budget reflects our priorities and sends a message to others about how we see our mission as a congregation of Christ. We prioritize hav ing a full-time Pastor who shepherds our life together, our individual spiritual lives, and our connections to the wider community. We prioritize having a safe and wel-

coming building that allows ministry, and visitors to feel welcome, and community activities or gatherings. We prioritize our committees that act as task forces for our mission.

Your pledge, your gifts to Faith ensure that we have the funding to keep these things going. Gifts can be made in other ways as well. We are deeply enriched not only by your generous financial contributions but also by the giving of your time and talents! Another way to give is through things like a Qualitative Charitable Distribution from your IRA/ Retirement account. This is something we often forget about, but is an easy, tax-friendly way to boost your impact on Faith's ministry!

We will have our Stewardship Sunday on November 10th. By now everyone should have their pledging packets, if not, please call or stop by the church office for yours. We hope to have the pledges in by Nov. 10th for our blessing of all the pledges that morning. Please consider what you are willing and able to give financially to aid the 2025 annual budget. The 2025 Proposed Budget, along with the Building Project for Technology, will be voted on after worship on Sunday, December 1st via paper ballots.

These next few months, please pray on how you might contribute to our life here at Faith.

The Outreach Committee on December Advent Outreach Giving

We have chosen the following groups to support during this Advent Season. We will have posters with gift tags on them to be taken and items purchased and returned to the church. We will be doing this during the entire month of December.

Laundry Love - vouchers are given once a month. A local laundromat proves the machines. Volunteers provide the clients with the soap, softener, and money for the machines. In some cases, this is the only time that laundry is done for some persons/families - once a month.

<u>Emmaus Cafe</u> - serves meals each Sunday at First Presbyterian Church. Meals are prepared by the church members and served by members and/or friends. Lately, they have been serving approx. 70 people a week. This is funded by their church and donations.

VESTRY NOTES FROM OCTOBER 14, 2024

<u>Budget</u> - The budget increased 1% for 2025. Mark Odell made a motion to accept the 2025 budget which was seconded by Mary Wildermuth. **Motion carried.**

Deacons - The Stewardship letter and final budget for pledge packets are to be handed out by the deacons on Oct 27th along with announcements in worship.

<u>Elders</u> - Choir director ad. is being distributed. Recognition of Connie Miller, Tammy Ales, and Pat Mundell on Sunday, Nov. 3rd after church worship hour.

Trustees – Pat Pagel is Building a temporary stand to access candles easily on the advent wreath. Church Sign is ready to power up and train for software. We need to write up guidelines/procedures for the sign messages. Alice Ganzley will be contacted for the static sign, which will complete the sing. During the 2024 Annual Meeting we voted to install a new rooftop HVAC system with Kelly's of up to \$55,000, however they have not been able to follow through. A proposal was made for Ragans. Mary Wildermuth made a motion to pay the excess expense of up to \$1000 from the Wendell Day Fund. Second by Dan Huss. **Motion carried.** The parsonage has a new exhaust hood, leaky faucet still exists. Pat Pagel will investigate tree trimming around the church to satisfy insurance.



Pastor and Sue Muntz are collaborating on transferring current content to the new site in the coming months. The office admin sub for Oct. 21-25th will be Mary Wildermuth volunteering. Discussed having a facilitator for Vestry - 2025

Building Improvement Plans - The technology upgrades vote has been rescheduled for Dec. 1st. Pat Mundell attended as a gust to speak on paper ballots. Paper ballots will be used. Lisa Shea made a motion to use paper ballots on Dec. 1. Second, by Mary Wildermuth. Motion carried. For future votes: All votes will be a show of hands except when paper ballots are requested. The Constitution/Bylaws need to be updated at the next Annual Meeting. Need to do a better job communicating BEFORE each vote. The tech committee will create a 5-minute pitch to the congregation. Vestry members will stay after worship to talk with people - coffee with the Vestry?' We should establish small group discussions. Further updates. Sue and Mark met to review the Carver Construction bid and contacted Scott about reducing the remodel to just the women's side and requested a less expensive countertop. Pew chairs are on hold, still exploring. We should get quotes for reupholstering the pews if we do keep them. Mary Wildermuth said she wants to create a group to look at options for carpet and pew chairs. Invitations will go to Friendship Circle, Harmony Guild, and the general congregation. Carriage house flooring option quotes discussed. Are there other flooring options we want to get quotes for carpet? The automatic button for the front door was installed on Sept 18th - The on/off switch is in the secretary's office in the high cupboard by the window.

<u>Old Business</u> - Mike Morgan and Mark Odell are following up with our insurance agent. Need a financial secretary, Pat Mundell is retiring and will need a replacement.

<u>New Business</u> - Markel Insurance renewal policy. Lisa Shea motioned to approve the Markel Insurance policy renewal. Second by Mark Butterworth. **Motion carried**.

The next meeting will be on Monday, November 11, 2024. Open to the Congregation.
