### Children in worship

Infants and children are always welcome to be part of the worship service here at Faith UCC. Faith is a place where we know it truly does take a village and there is no such thing as 'someone else's kids.' We belong to one another and we know how important it is for our children to worship, as well as for our children to teach us how to worship.

Our Nursery: Childcare services are available each Sunday. Our nursery is staffed by a church employee who has undergone a background check and completed training in childcare and first aid. Our nursery is open to infants through 5-year-olds.

For those children who wish to remain in worship or are older than 5, we have a children's corner in the front of the sanctuary where kids can keep their hands busy as they listen and participate. There are things to color, fidget toys, puzzles, books, etc.

We are also now experimenting with Children's Church! Sunday after the Children's Moment in worship, all the children are invited to go downstairs for a snack, activities, and a lesson.

### Bible Study on Tuesdays

Pastor Paris hosts a weekly Bible Study on Tuesdays at 1 pm from September through May. We are making our way through the entire Bible, starting with the New Testament. All are welcome to join us! We are currently in the book of Mark.

### Wednesday Night Youth Christian Education

At Faith UCC, we take seriously the notion that we are lifetime learners and that includes learning about and exploring our faith. We offer classes for our youth in which they learn and talk about the Bible, as well as learn about living in the way of Jesus., engage with their Creator, and learn to love their neighbors.

Christian Education meets on Wednesdays at 5:15 pm. Dinner is provided for all at 5:15 pm, and then we have time for music, before finishing with our lesson of the day. Pick-up is at 6:30 pm. Students in 5th grade and above break off at 6:00 pm to have a Confirmation class with Pastor until 7 pm. *Note that if there is no school or if there are school conferences happening, we will not have class.*

"As a botanist, Robin Wall Kimmerer has been trained to ask questions of nature with the tools of science. As a member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, she embraces the notion that plants and animals are our oldest teachers. In *Braiding Sweetgrass*, Kimmerer brings these two lenses of knowledge together to take us on "a journey that is every bit as mythic as it is scientific, as sacred as it is historical, as clever as it is wise" (Elizabeth Gilbert). Drawing on her life as an indigenous scientist, and as a woman, Kimmerer shows how other living beings--asters and goldenrod, strawberries and squash--offer us gifts and lessons, even if we've forgotten how to hear their voices. In reflections, she circles toward a central argument: that the awakening of ecological consciousness requires the acknowledgment and celebration of our reciprocal relationship with the rest of the living world."- Book note

The composting bins will be used for collecting food waste in their homes which can be composted at home or dropped off at the city's transfer station. ## Congregational Life Grant Reports

The Congregational Life Grant Committee met to discuss and distribute funds for the Fall 2024 grant cycle. \$4,2435.15 was available. Sixteen grants were submitted for a total of \$11,975, so it was impossible to fund all grants. Nine grants were funded, with the majority at 30%-50% of the original request. Six grants were denied, due to lack of funds. The Vestry was presented with the recommendations from the Grant Committee and approved their suggestions on Monday, September 9, 2024.

Those grants awarded included:

1. Meals for our homebound members
2. Support for Crop Walk and other community group support. (2 combination requests)
3. Honorariums for special musicians during worship services
4. Supporting Almoner Fund
5. Christmas gifts for children in need
6. Support of church fellowship activities
7. Fundraising projects for the building improvement fund
8. AED (Defibrillator)

We thank the members of the congregation for the time to write and implement the grants. We are proud to belong to a congregation that strives to serve our community!

**VESTRY SUMMARY & STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN**

**Vestry September Meeting:** This month the Vestry met to go over regular business, as well as to engage the Pastor’s Annual Review.

- \* The Deacons began to work on the 2025 budget with our treasurer and endowment chair. The Congregation will vote on the budget in December.
- \* The Elders combed through the Membership list and a handful of were dropped due to inactivity and failure to respond to a their letter. This does not mean we wouldn’t gladly welcome old members back into our congregation, they will just be dropped from our numbers that go to churchwide. Elders will advertise for a new Choir Director, to lead the choir, bells, collaborate on special music, and act as a worship cantor.
- \* Pat Pagel is helping us reposition the advent wreath his grandfather made so that it is more accessible. We also voted to sign the Organ Hold Harmless Clause with Levsen Organ Company. The elevator needed repairs and meeting room TV stopped working.
- \* For Pastor’s Annual Review the Elders survey sent to Vestry, all positive responses.
- \* Vestry continued brainstorming building improvements. We want to vote on technology upgrades next and then host small groups to invite the congregation into the brainstorming process on how to make the best of our remodeling intentions. We now have some quotes for the flooring, the door is now automated, and we want to pursue Carver’s options for the downstairs restrooms. An anonymous donation was given to update the entry way, so we will work to brighten up that space.
- \* We’re so close to finishing up our new sign! Thank you Pat Pagel for leading the way.
- \* Grant recommendations from the Congregational Life committee were approved.
